Hemp crop nomenclature

Seed crop

A crop is grown for producing seeds that can be used for <u>planting</u> or selling as a <u>commodity</u>.

Grain crop

A crop that is grown for harvesting seeds as grain, which can be used for <u>industrial</u> <u>purposes as human food</u>.

Food crop

A crop is grown for producing <u>food products for human consumption</u>, such as hemp seeds, oil, milk, flour, protein powder, etc. Grain and Food crop terms can be used interchangeably.

Biomass crop

A crop that is grown for <u>producing biomass</u>, which is the plant material (<u>stems, leaves, flowers</u>) that can be used for specific industrial applications such as biofuel production, composting, etc.

Fibre crop

A crop that is grown for <u>producing fibre</u> from the bast (outer layer) <u>and hurd</u> (inner core) of the stem, which can be used for making textiles, paper, rope, building materials, or bioplastics. Fibre and Biomass crop terms can be used interchangeably.

Feed crop:

A crop that is grown for providing <u>feed to livestock animals</u>, either as fresh forage or as hay or silage.

Fodder crop

A crop that is grown for providing <u>fodder to livestock animals</u>, which is the chopped and processed plant material (usually stems and leaves) that can be mixed with other ingredients to make a balanced diet.
